#### Elbow Cay Lighthouse:

An icon! Hope Town's red and white striped lighthouse was built in 1863 and is one of only three kerosenepowered lighthouses in the world, and all three are in the Bahamas. The large Fresnel lens floating in a bath of mercury generates a light visible more than 17 miles away. pirate cannon balls as the powering weights. # **Hope Town History**

Prior to the discovery of the new world, Lucayan Indians inhabited Elbow cay and the surrounding cays. The Lucayans Indians were peaceful and lived off the land by fishing and primitive agriculture. In 1492, it is believed that Christopher Columbus hit landfall in either San Salvador or Samana cay. With introductions of the Spaniards, the Lucayan Indians were forced into slavery, and eventually died off from the diseases that were introduced to their once isolated and primitive culture. The Bahamas remained primarily uninhabited for a long period; though many attempts were made but were unsuccessful due to isolation, storms, and agriculture difficulties.

During the time of the revolutionary war (1775-1783) and the struggle for independence of the thirteen colonies in America, those loyal to England, under King George III rule, sought refuge in the Bahamas, a British commonwealth. Many "Loyalists" as they were called, left America bringing every possession, down to the bricks from their lavish estates in America. The loyalists endured very harsh living environments and had to assimilate to the agriculture differences in America. Many were unsuccessful in their attempts and lost their fortunes along the way. During the 1790s, one of the more prominent settlers, Wyannie Malone, a loyalist descendant and widow, successfully settled here in hope town. Many descendants of Wyannie Malone still live on the island or on surrounding cays. Some of her descendants have more common last names like Malone, Russell, Albury, and Cash. a complete genealogy of Wyannie Malone can be traced while visiting the Wyannie Malone historical museum.

The islands of the Bahamas were a haven to pirates preying on merchant ships on their way to the New World and South America. The islands were home to the likes of Blackbeard and Anne Bonny, and Calico Jack. In more recent years, local Bahamians often supplemented their meager incomes by "wrecking", or salvaging goods and supplies off the wrecked ships on their way to the Americas. It is believed locally that land was acquired from desperate families by trading food and supplies for land.

To protect the shipping interests abroad, the British Imperial lighthouse service was commissioned to build eleven major lighthouses in the Bahamas. With wrecks on the increase in the Hope Town area, the Imperial Lighthouse service built the Elbow Reef lighthouse in 1864, but not without some sabotage from the locals whose major source of income was from wrecking and salvaging. When first built, the lighthouse showed a standing light, that is, it did not flash.
